LiveContent 2.0 goals:

1. Insert LiveContent DVD into DVD drive
2. Restart computer
3. While computer is restarting, press and hold the following key to choose boot device – PC: F12, Mac: "C"
4. At menu screen, choose "Boot LiveContent 2.0"



Instructions:

- LiveContent 2.0 is a LiveDVD and can boot directly from the DVD without installing the software on a computer. The LiveDVD contains:
- Fedora 8, a free, open source GNU/Linux-based operating system
 - Creative Commons-licensed content such as audio, video, image, text and educational resources from organizations like Flickr, Jamendo, blip.tv, Wikimedia Commons
 - Free, open source creativity, productivity, and entertainment applications like OpenOffice.org, Inkscape, and The GIMP
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
